#### PATRON SAINT REPORT GUIDELINES

The purpose of the Patron Saint Report is to help you find a Christian "hero". Someone you can model your life after. When choosing your saint, look at the Christian life that person led. Don't choose your saint solely on the attractiveness or appeal of the name. Your Patron Saint must be a recognized saint of the Catholic Church. The Religious Education office and local libraries have ample reference materials and your teacher can give you advice and direction.

The report can be written or typed and should be at least one page in length. Include as much of the following information in your report as possible. You may not be able to find all of this information on your saint. Do the <u>best</u> you can.

## The report should include:

- -The saint's name, birth date and feast day.
- Where and when the saint lived.
- What work, deeds or actions the saint performed that resulted in his/her canonization.
- An interesting story you could relate about this saint's life.
- What virtues did this saint practice in his/her life?
- What aspect of this person's Christian life attracted you?

- How is this saint a model for Christians today?
